

#### Dear Parents:

The beginning of February brings Term 1 to an end. Throughout this term, our students have experienced many interesting and exciting learning opportunities. During my visits to classrooms, I have been extremely impressed by the level of student engagement and the efforts of our staff to support student learning. On Monday, February 10, parents will receive their child's Term 1 Report Card. Although there are no formal interviews scheduled at this time, parents who have questions regarding their child's achievement on this report card are asked to contact their child's teacher. In this way we can continue to work together to help each student reach their full potential.

This winter has been an extremely cold one where we have experienced many consecutive days of sub-zero temperatures. During these times, we do our best to keep our students safe from the elements by implementing early entry and indoor nutrition breaks. Please ensure that your children are dressed appropriately for these conditions and remind your children of the importance of wearing all of their winter gear when they are going outside. At times, we have noticed that some of our students make inappropriate choices because they underestimate the weather conditions. You can also help by ensuring that students do not arrive at school before 8:50 a.m. This is the time when supervision begins and the time of our early entry on extreme weather days. Students who arrive prior to this time will be unsupervised or in the event of sub-zero temperatures, will have to wait outside until our early entry begins.

Last year, our School Council ran a Bag2School Fundraiser which was extremely successful. Plans are now under way to do this again this spring. Your can help by collecting items of clothing that you no longer need and donate them to the school. The Bag2School organization pays us \$200 per tonne for these items and makes them available to developing countries around the world. Please consider helping our School Council with this initiative. More information will be coming home at a later date. In closing, I wish to thank parents for their support during the first term and I look forward to a successful Term 2 for our students.
