

#### Dear Parents:

As we enter March, I would like to announce another staffing change at Pioneer Park. At the beginning of February, Mrs. McKeon, one of our Early Childhood Educators, resigned her position to pursue a career in teaching. Mrs. McKeon was successful in being appointed to the Occasional Teachers Roster with our Board. I wish to thank Mrs. McKeon for her work at Pioneer Park over the past two years and I wish her continued success in her role as an Occasional Teacher. Miss Rinzema, an extended day ECE working in B5 has now moved to the core day position that became available with Mrs. McKeon's resignation. I am pleased to announce that Ms. P. Brown has been hired as the new extended day ECE (afternoon shift). Ms. Brown will be working with Mrs. Butler, Mrs. Twomey and the students of B5. Welcome Ms. Brown.

At this time of year, principals begin the process of planning for the next school year. To help me with my planning, I am requesting your help. Although Kindergarten registration has come and gone, I do recognize that there may be kindergarten aged students within our community who have not yet registered. If you have a child who is age appropriate for kindergarten (born 2009 or 2010) please call the school to make arrangements to complete the registration process. Please pass this information along to any families that you know of who also have students of kindergarten age. Also, if you are planning to move out of our Pioneer Park area, I would appreciate knowing about this. By doing so, I can contact your child's new school so they can also plan appropriately.

This winter has been an extremely harsh one with many consecutive days of sub-zero temperatures. Although we permit early entry on those extremely cold days, we still find many children arriving as early as 8:30 a.m. Please help us keep our students safe by ensuring that they are dressed appropriately for the weather conditions and arrive at school when supervision begins at 8:50 a.m. In the event of extremely cold weather, this is the time when they will be permitted to enter the school.


