## TRANSPORTATION

### STSWR - Website Student Login

The student login feature on our website will be available for use August 21, 2014. Parents and students will be able to login and view their transportation details for the next school year.

Please note: any address changes need to be done through your school. If you are moving this summer or change your sitter arrangements for the fall, you should communicate the change of address to your child's school before the end of the 2014-15 school year.

Visit the site <u>www.stswr.ca</u> and click on student login

To login you will have to enter the following information:

Ontario Education Number (from report card) Students birth date (day, month, year) Street Number (street # from student's home address) School (select Pioneer Park from the drop down)

Since most JK students will not have an OEN number prior to September, STSWR will be sending a direct mail out to the families of Junior and Senior Kindergarten students that will be transported next year. That information will be mailed out during the week of August 15th.

A direct mail out will also be sent in August to the families with special needs students that will be transported in September.
