HEADLICE

As in most schools, we have an issue with headlice from time to time. When a parent reports a child with headlice, a notice is sent home to everyone in that child's class. If the affected child has a sibling in our school, we also send home a notice in that class as well as a precaution. This child is then checked at the school upon re-entrance after treatment. Our Board policy is that the child must be nit (egg) free before they may return to the classroom. If you find headlice, please inform the office immediately. If you are unsure about what headlice looks like, we suggest you consult with your hair stylist/ barber, pharmacist or family doctor. Please check your child on a regular basis. If you have any questions, please call the school.

REMINDER...

To ensure the safety of our students, please do not send your child to school prior to 8:50 am. There is <u>no supervision</u> prior to 8:50 am.

Breakfast Club is open on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at 8:15 a.m. Registration is required, please complete a registration form.

Parking at Pioneer Park

Please do not use the parking lot as a drop-off or pick up location before and after school as every spot is required to accommodate our staff. Limited parking is available on Upper Canada Drive at specific locations. Please be aware of the "No Stopping" and "No Parking" signs that are prevalent on both sides of the street in front of the school. By-law enforcement officers regularly patrol Upper Canada Drive during entry and dismissal times. Persons who are illegally stopped in a "No Stopping" zone may receive a ticket. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Has your child arrived safely at school?? Your child's safety is our number one priority.

When your child is marked absent at school, we work diligently to determine where they might be. This involves the very time consuming process of calling all the contact numbers you have provided. This process can take well over an hour, so if your child is missing, we have lost an hour of valuable time in locating your child.

Your child may return to play outside the school after 3:45 pm. Please be aware that there is <u>no supervision</u> for your child and they may <u>not enter</u> the building to use the facilities.
