FROM THE LIBRARY

The Silver Birch Reading Program is up and running! We have 32 Express readers, 28 Fiction readers and 22 Non Fiction readers. All of these students will be reading recently published books by Canadian authors. Students that read at least 5 in their category will be able to vote for their favorite book. Voting day will be in mid April. You can help by

encouraging your child to read and then return the Silver Birch books promptly.

New this year

All students have a Google Drive account set up through the WRDSB. Students will be able to comment on the Silver Birch books they have read on Google Drive. Each student has a Google Drive account with a User Name and Password. Students can make a comment on the books they have read but I ask that there are no "spoilers". A spoiler is something that spoils the book for the next reader -so no spoilers please! An example of a spoiler would be telling the ending of the book.

The Blue Spruce Reading program is up and running as well! The reading has already started for our JK to Grade 3 students. You could ask them if they had a Blue Spruce story today and if so what was it about?
